
TRIKING yet dignified, this Saloon, by the famous Coachbuilders, Charlesworth of Coventry, is a study in harmonious line. It is similar generally to the 1933 model which has proved so popular, but a number of detail improvements have been effected; among these the new sloping dash line and bonnet louvres will be noted. The roof is of the sliding type, and the four doors are each fitted with a quick-lift winding window. The deep and softly sprung seating, with generous head and leg-room, provide luxurious comfort. The front bucket seats are instantly adjustable, and the rear seating has three armrests, the central rest folding to give accommodation to a third person if desired. The equipment includes direction indicators sunk in the rear quarters, two companions, and an enclosed luggage locker capable of holding two suitcases, the door of which when open forms a rigid platform capable of carrying the heaviest trunks, of design similar to that of the "Speed Twenty" Coupe illustrated overleaf.







A further advantage of this gearbox is that there is nothing new to learn. The technique of changing is normal; the single plate clutch is sweet, certain and long-lived, and the short stiff gear lever falls conveniently to hand.

ALVIS racing cars as long ago as 1925, and which contributed so much to the remarkable record of ALVIS success in international events, it has thus been thoroughly tested out under the most severe conditions. In this design road shocks cannot be communicated from one wheel to another or affect the steering, and gyroscopic re-actions are entirely eliminated. Directional stability, roadholding, and comfort are enhanced to a degree—quite unattainable in conventional designs.










HIS model has made a very strong appeal to the Sports car enthusiast. Its remarkable performance—ninety miles per hour in under fifty seconds—is retained, while road-holding, ease of driving, and appearance are enhanced, in this 1934 model. The body is perhaps the prettiest of its type ever designed, the curves of the doors and down-swept tail being in perfect harmony with the graceful long sweeping lines of the wings and running boards. Though of ultrasporting appearance, it is essentially practical, comfortable and convenient. Four doors allow individual access to the unusually roomy seating; the front seats are of the bucket type, instantly adjustable, and a pneumatic seat cushion allows the rear passengers to be carried low within the body in luxurious comfort. There is an enclosed luggage locker in the tail, the door of which, when open, forms a strong carrier for additional luggage. The single pane screen folds flat when required.

Carrier for additional luggage. The single palle screen loss in Weather protection has received special study. The hood and rigid side curtains, made to ALVIS patents, fit snugly and do not rattle. The hood cover is of special design, permanently fixed to the body, and the tonneau cover can be arranged to the rear seats only, the three passengers' seats, or the entire body and steering wheel.
